Rifle Platoon Commander Jun. Lieutenant Fedko participated in the WWII since June 1941. As part of 32nd Independent Cavalry Artillery Squadron (14th Cavalry Division, 5th Cavalry Corps), he fought on Bryansk, Southwestern, Don, Voronezh, Central and 1st Ukrainian Front. From July 1942 to Feb. 1943 he was a prisoner of war in the camp at the city of Kastornie. Committed an escape and passed thru special verification. Commanded a Rifle Platoon until was seriously wounded in July of 1944 (that was his 4th and final wounding; he was transferred to the reserve after being checked out from the hospital).

Младший лейтенант Федько на начало войны находился в должности командира стрелковой роты, 32-го отдельного кавалерийского артиллерийского батальона (14-я кав. дивизия, 5-й кав. корпус). Участник боев на Брянском, Юго-Западном, Донском, Воронежском, Центральном и 1-м Украинском фронтах. Был захвачен в плен и находился в лагере для военнопленных под Касторным с июля 1942 по фев. 1943. Бежал и успешно прошел проверку НКВД, после чего был поставлен на ком. стрелковой роты. Успешно сражался вплоть до своего тяжелого ранения (4-го по счету), после чего был списан как не годный к службе. С 1944г. в запасе.

Senior Lieutenant Roze Y.Y. participated in WWII since 1941 (123rd Guards Rifle Regiment, 43rd Guards Rifle Division, 22nd Army). As a sniper, his personal score is a whopping 116 kills. As a reconnaissance soldier (and later platoon commander), he personally took 8 POW's during 12 daring missions deep into enemy's rear. Became a full cavalier of Order of Glory on March 24, 1945. Victory Parades of 1945, 1985, 1990 and 1995 participant.

Lieutenant Morozov I.I. participated in WWII since May 1942. Commander of sapper crew of 209th Independent Sapper Battalion (143rd Rifle Division, 13th Army), he demolishing a bridge, for which he received Glory 3rd Class on 01/1944. On another occasion, he disabled mines on another bridge, and was awarded with Glory 2nd Class on 08/1944. Promoted to Sergeant Major, he displayed exemplary bravery under heavy fire, while disabling field mines (in Poland), thus creating a passage for troops of his division. Became a full cavalier of Order of Glory on May 31st 1945.

*This is a **very rare** case - twice cavalier of the early type Orders, since even one such Order in the 1930's was already a very scarce occurrence, and commanded a lot of prestige and respect. Most of such prominent early multi-award veterans were purged during Stalin's Purges of 1937-1940.*

Herbert Warnke (02/24/1902-03/26/1975) - Chairman of the FDGB and member of the Politburo of the Central Committee of the SED in the GDR.

Warnke graduated from 1920 - 1924 as a lesson rivets. He joined 1923 the KPD and in 1924 – 1928 was a member of the German Metalworkers' Union. From 1929 to 1930 he was the Chairman of Blohm & Voss in Hamburg, then secretary of the District Committee of the Revolutionary union opposition in Bremen, secretary for trade union matters in the district KPD leadership Weser-Ems and 1932 - 1933 a member of the Reichstag.

1933 - 1935 he was secretary of the Red Trade Union International in Saarbrücken and Paris and until 1938 a member of the section line north of the KPD in


Copenhagen. From 1939 to 1943 he was in Sweden and interned in detention, after he was editor of the journal "The way to life" .

Upon his return to Germany was in 1946 he Chairman of the National Board of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern and a member of the Federal Executive Board, 1948 first chairman of the Federal Board of FDGB. Since 1949, he was a member of the party's executive committee and Politburo of the SED and deputy of the People. 1950, he was a member of the Secretariat, 1953 nominee and 1958 member of the Politburo of the CC of the SED. It was created in 1949 a member of the Executive Committee, 1953 a Vice President and 1969 member of the Office of the General Council of the World Trade Union Confederation. Since 1971, he was a member of the State Council.

Warnke received the 1955 Patriotic Order of Merit, 1962 the Karl Marx Order, 1967 the Lenin Peace Prize and in 1972 the Order of Lenin. His urn is buried in the Memorial of the socialists on the central Friedrichsfelde cemetery in Berlin-Lichtenberg.
