

The heroic and greatly respected Johanna Catherina Schubert was born in Nijmegen in 1763. Her tombstone erroneously gave her birth as 1772 (which was repeated on this medal) and also called her the 'Countess of Ross', a title she never used in her lifetime. In 1787, she married John Matthias Ross, director of the Holland Society of Sciences. The couple had one son, but Ross died a year later. The widow Schubert who remarried then divorced, moved to Warsaw with her son where she was known as Mrs. Ross. During the Napoleonic War, she gave shelter to the Dutch soldiers in Napoleon's army, and in 1813, bravely went to the Russian headquarters to affect the release of all the Dutch prisoners of war. Alexander I admired Ross and apparently befriended her.

The image of Nicholas on his deathbed is well-known from a number of contemporary engraved prints but the cataloguers are unaware of any other plaquettes. Seryakov came from Serf stock, joining the military as a child. He served as a bandsman in a Kiev Grenadier regiment, from where he was sent to a clerical job in St. Petersburg. His artistic talents were soon spotted, but his background prevented any promotion and it took a petition to the Tsar before was admitted to the Academy of Arts in 1847 at the age of 23. He later earned the status of "Free Artist" and from 1858 was able to travel in France and Italy for six years. He was elected an Academician on his return. His main works seem to be woodcuts, engraving and book illustration. He taught engraving to a number of students of whom Vasily Vasilyevich Mate is probably the best known. Perhaps he made this tribute to the Tsar as it was to him that he owed his whole artistic life.



Alexander Arkadievich Suvorov (1804-1882) was the grandson of the renowned Fieldmarshal Alexander Vasiliyevich Suvorov, Count of Rymnik, Generalissimo of all Russia, and son of Lt. General Arkadi Suvorov, who fought in the Napoleonic and Turkish Wars. He served as Governor General of Riga from 1848 to 1861, then as Governor General of St. Petersburg until 1866. It was A.A. Suvorov who announced the death of Tsar Alexander II at the hands of assassins in 1881. This medal was issued by one of the many societies of which he was a patron during his time as General Governor of St. Petersburg.







Extremely Rave 1916 Patterns

During World War I, Russia proposed to devalue the copper currency yet again, going from 50 Roubles to the pood to 75 Roubles to the pood. A series of patterns were made to that end. But because of the chaos into which Russia had devolved, the new coinage idea was abandoned, and today the 1916 patterns are extremely rare.




