Built in memory of Russia's victories, notably in the Russo-Turkish War of 1828, the arch was designed by Vasily Stasov. City leaders originally planned to place it by Obvodny Canal, but as the city limits expanded further south, the site was moved to the intersection of the Moscow Road and the Ligovsky Canal. Its new location, created the added benefit of making the Triumphal Arch an impressive gateway to the capital.

A Great Russian Gold Rarity, the 1876 25 Roubles



Grand Duke Vladimir Alexandrovich 30th Birthday Commemorative 25 Roubles 1876 CΠΕ. GOLD. Bit 565 (R3), Fr 162, Sev 501 (RRRR), Uzd 4210 (RRR). Struck to serve as a memento of the 30th birthday of the Tsar's fourth son Vladimir, only 100 pieces of this extremely rare coin were minted. Russia issued just four large gold coin types: the 1902 Nicholas II portrait 37 ½ Roubles, the 1896 and 1908 25 Roubles and this type. Of the four, this is the rarest and most elusive, a great prize for the collector. Authenticated and graded by PCGS PR 58. Slight hint of handling, but superior in grade for the existent pieces of this extremely rare issue. Crisp types, pleasing wheaten gold.



Rodion Egorovich Grinvald (Mauritz-Reinhold v. Grünewaldt, 1797-1877) was a major general, Commander of the Horse Guard.

Родион (Мориц Рейнгольд) Егорович Гринвальд (1797—1877) — генерал от кавалерии, главноуправляющий Государственным коннозаводством, член Государственного совета.

- 1827 Неоднократно выполнял поручения императора Николая I, касающиеся рекрутских наборов, государственного коннозаводства.
- 1831 назначен командиром Новгородского кирасирского полка, во главе которого находился при штурме Варшавы 25 и 26 августа.
- 25 июня 1833 г. произведён в генерал-майоры и получил в командование Кавалергардский полк,
 возглавил 1-ю гвардейскую кирасирскую бригаду
- 1844 назначен гвардейской кирасирской дивизией. Произведён в генерал-лейтенанты.
- 1856 в день коронации императора Александра II, произведён в генералы от кавалерии и 30 сентября того же года назначен вице-председателем Комиссии для улучшения по военной части и членом Комиссии по учреждению Императорской кавалерийской академии
- 1859 назначен главноуправляющим Государственным коннозаводством. На этом посту Гринвальд ввёл значительные улучшения в организации коннозаводского дела, сэкономив при этом значительные средства. Эти меры превратили ведомство государственного коннозаводства из исключительно военного в общегосударственное учреждение.
